It focuses on attractive long-term trends, such as 'digitization of financial services', 'finance and aging' and 'financial services in emerging markets'. Proprietary valuation models are used to select stocks with good earnings prospects and a reasonable valuation.

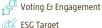

#### Performance

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 3.29%.

Robeco New World Financials had a return above the benchmark. Two trends contributed positively to performance, with Digital Finance being the best contributor to performance, followed by Aging Finance. The best contributors to performance were Circle, Coinbase, Robinhood Markets, Hundsun Technologies, Nu Holdings, Hana Financial, Citigroup and Goldman Sachs. The biggest detractors from performance were Adven, Wise and Bank Rakvat Indonesia. The industry groups capital markets, Insurance and software made the biggest positive contribution to performance, while banks detracted the most.

#### Market development

Despite geopolitical volatility, capital markets remain resilient. The MSCI AC World Index rose 4.5% in June, and financials gained 3.6%, led by European and emerging market financials. Digital Finance saw strong performance from Circle (IPO up 850%), Coinbase (+37%), and Robinhood (+37%). Stablecoins gained momentum following the GENIUS Act, with adoption news from JP Morgan, Amazon, Walmart, Mastercard, and PayPal. Visa and Mastercard fell 5.5%, while Adyen (-8%) and Wise (-7%) also declined. In Aging Finance, improved M&A activity helped Goldman Sachs (+14%) and KKR (+6%). The Fed's stress test results, SCB and SLR proposals benefited Goldman, Morgan Stanley, and Bank of America. JP Morgan announced a USD 50 bln buyback and 7% dividend hike. Emerging Finance was strong in South Korea, China, and Brazil. Hana Financial is up 51% YTD, Ping An rose 4%, and Techcom Bank gained 8%. Improving global liquidity, a weaker dollar, and stable oil support emerging market outlooks across India, Indonesia, Brazil, and Mexico.

#### Expectation of fund manager

Global equity markets in 2025 remain highly correlated with global liquidity indicators. Bond yields signal the onset of a new inflationary regime, driven by structural inflation from Covid-19-era stimulus and ongoing geopolitical risks. In Aging Finance, we are witnessing a shift of the retirement burden from the state or corporation to the individual. In emerging markets, policy uncertainty and the ability of central banks to lower rates are weighing on prospects for 2025. However, emerging market FX is notably cheaper today compared to the onset of Trump's first trade war in 2018. The outperformance of Digital Finance companies has largely flown under the radar in 2024. Digital wallets continue to grow transaction volumes, and AI agents are emerging as one of the most transformative trends of the year.

Within the trends, the fund managers select the companies that will best capitalize on long-term trend growth. How much we invest depends on the stock valuation, where we look for growth at a reasonable price. As we look top-down at trends and bottom-up at stock selection, regional or sector spreads are merely the result of the investment process, though we do monitor limits.

#### Sustainability

The fund incorporates sustainability in the investment process through exclusions, ESG integration, engagement and voting. The fund does not invest in issuers that are in breach of international norms or where activities have been deemed detrimental to society following Robeco's exclusion policy. Financially material ESG factors are integrated in the bottom-up investment analysis to assess existing and potential ESG risks and opportunities. In the stock selection the fund limits exposure to elevated sustainability risks. The fund targets at least 20% lower carbon footprint compared to the reference index. In addition, where a stock issuer is flagged for breaching international standards in the ongoing monitoring, the issuer will become subject to engagement. Lastly, the fund makes use of shareholder rights and applies proxy voting in accordance with Robeco's proxy voting policy.

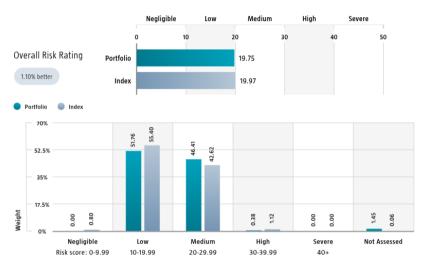

## Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating

The Portfolio Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating chart displays the portfolio's ESG Risk Rating. This is calculated by multiplying each portfolio component's Sustainalytics ESG Risk Rating by its respective portfolio weight. The Distribution across Sustainalytics ESG Risk levels chart shows the portfolio allocations broken into Sustainalytics' five ESG risk levels: negligible (0-10), low (10-20), medium (20-30), high (30-40) and severe (40+), providing an overview of portfolio exposure to the different ESG risk levels. Index scores are provided alongside the portfolio scores, highlighting the portfolio's ESG risk level compared to the index.

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# **Environmental Footprint**

Environmental footprint expresses the total resource consumption of the portfolio per mUSD invested. Each assessed company's footprint is calculated by normalizing resources consumed by the company's enterprise value including cash (EVIC). We aggregate these figures to portfolio level using a weighted average, multiplying each assessed portfolio constituent's footprint by its respective position weight. For comparison, index footprints are shown besides that of the portfolio. The equivalent factors that are used for comparison between the portfolio and index represent European averages and are based on third-party sources combined with own estimates. As such, the figures presented are intended for illustrative purposes and are purely an indication. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.



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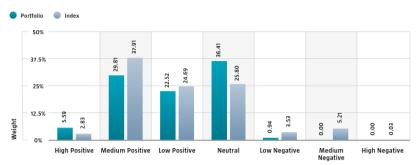


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## **SDG Impact Alignment**

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs and assign a total SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. For comparison, index figures are provided alongside that of the portfolio. Only holdings mapped as corporates are included in the figures.

## Engagement

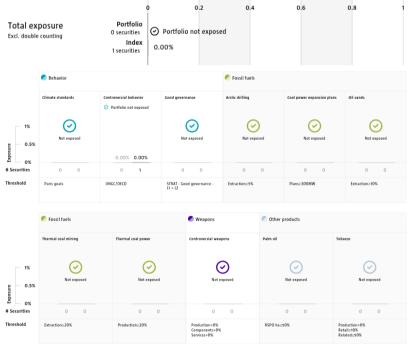
Robeco distinguishes between three types of engagement. Value Engagement focuses on long-term issues that are financially material and/or are causing adverse sustainability impacts. The themes can be broken into Environmental, Social, Governance, or Voting-related. SDG Engagement aims to drive a clear and measurable improvement in a company's SDG contribution. Enhanced engagement is triggered by misconduct and focuses on companies severely breaching internationals standards. The report is based on all companies in the portfolio for which engagement activities have taken place during the past 12 months. Note that companies may be under engagement in multiple categories simultaneously. While the total portfolio exposure excludes double counting, it may not equal the sum of individual category exposures.

The fund invests in companies in the financial sector and can partly invest in the financial sector-oriented companies outside the formal MSCI Financials. It focuses on attractive long-term trends, such as 'digitization of financial services', 'finance and aging' and 'financial services in emerging markets'. Proprietary valuation models are used to select stocks with good earnings prospects and a reasonable valuation.

The fund promotes E&S (i.e. Environmental and Social) characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of the European Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation, integrates sustainability risks in the investment process and applies Robeco's Good Governance policy. The fund applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to, normative, activity-based and region-based exclusions, proxy voting and engagement.

Patrick Lemmens is Lead Portfolio Manager and member of the Thematic Investing team. He has a focus on financials/fintech. Prior to joining Robeco in 2008, he managed the ABN AMRO Financials fund from October 2003 to December 2007. Previously, he held the position of Analyst of Global Financials at ABN AMRO and was Global Sector Coordinator of the Financial Institutions Equities Group at ABN AMRO. Patrick Lemmens started his career in the investment industry in 1993. He holds a Master's in Business Economics from Erasmus University Rotterdam and is a Certified European Financial Analyst. Michiel van Voorst is Portfolio Manager and member of the Thematic Investing team. He has a focus on financials/fintech/next digital billion. In 2020, Michiel rejoined Robeco from Union Bancaire Privée in Hong Kong where he was CIO Asian Equities. Prior to that, Michiel spent 12 years at Robeco in several senior positions including senior portfolio manager Rolinco Global Growth fund and Robeco Asian Stars. Prior to joining Robeco in 2005, Michiel was Portfolio Manager US Equity at PGGM and Economist with Rabobank Netherlands. Michiel started his career in the investment industry in 1996. Michiel van Voorst holds a Master's in Economics from University of Utrecht and is a CFA® Charterholder. Koos Burema is Co-Portfolio Manager and member of the Thematic Investing team. #### Fiscal product treatment

The fund is established in Luxembourg and is subject to the Luxembourg tax laws and regulations. The fund is not liable to pay any corporation, income, dividend or capital gains tax in Luxembourg. The fund is subject to an annual subscription tax ('tax d'abonnement') in Luxembourg, which amounts to 0.05% of the net asset value of the fund. This tax is included in the net asset value of the fund can in principle use the Luxembourg treaty network to partially recover any withholding tax on its income.
