

Performance commentary

The UBS (Lux) Security Equity Fund outperformed the benchmark in the last quarter. Referring to our subthemes, the strongest contributor was IT security, followed by crime prevention. On the other hand, Health Prevention was the main laggard. Despite solid quarterly results, markets are fearing additional volatility (e.g. tariffs) driven by the new US administration.

On a company level, the main positive contributor was Okta, an IT security company. The company published better-than-expected quarterly numbers and raised the yearly guidance. Okta now anticipates revenue growth of 9% – 10% versus 7% previously (FY25 Fourth-Quarter Earnings, 03.03.2025). On the other hand, the main detractor was Illumina (health protection), we believe it was mainly driven by 1) China placing the company on an "Unreliable Entity List" (Illumina webpage, 10.02.2025), 2) fears about cuts in the National Institute of Health budget (NIH), and the announcement of a new sequencing machine by a competitor.

Market comments

In the last quarter, global equity markets closed lower, driven by 1) uncertainties around US President Trump's tariff policy and the US's stance with respect to Russia/Ukraine, 2) a softer US labour market report for February, which grew by 151,000 compared to the consensus forecast of 160,000. 3) The European Central Bank lowered interest rates for the sixth time since June, reducing the deposit rate by 25 basis points to 2.5%, while other central banks, such as the US Federal Reserve and the Bank of Japan, left interest rates unchanged in March. 4) The European Commission mobilised a EUR 800bn defence package, and Germany's Chancellor Friedrich Merz got approval for EUR 500 bn in infrastructure spending and exempting defence spending over 1% of GDP from the "debt brake". (Bloomberg)

Notable news from the security and safety sector:

• Amazon lost its legal battle against a record USD 812m fine handed out by Luxembourg's privacy regulator, the National Commission for Data Protection (CNPD). The CNPD had penalised Amazon for processing personal data in breach of EU privacy rules, known as the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). Amazon said it was considering appealing the court ruling (Reuters, 19.03.2025).

• An interesting case study was published concerning a breach at the Littleton Electric Light and Water Departments in Massachusetts (USA), which occurred back in November 2023. Investigators found that Volt Typhoon (a Chinese hacker group) had infiltrated their systems in February 2023 and collected data about the power systems. In other words, hackers were inside this utility company for nearly a year and exfiltrated specific data related to operating procedures and energy grid operations (SecurityWeek, 12.03.2025).

• Japan's NTT Communications Corp., a Japanese telecommunications company owned by NTT, said data from nearly 18,000 companies may have been stolen in a cyberattack in February. Information about individual customers was not affected, the intruders compromised two devices in NTT internal systems, according to the company (NTT, 05.03.2025).

• Digital crime in Switzerland has once again increased significantly, according to the Swiss Federal Statistical Office. In 2024, the number of offences committed digitally rose by 35% compared to the previous year. A total of over 59,000 digital offences were recorded. The increase in phishing attacks (+56%) and the misuse of online payment systems, prepaid cards or foreign identities (+105%) is striking (Swissinfo, 24.03.2025).

These examples show the critical nature of security and safety.

Comments on transactions

As usual, we did some rebalancing. In the last quarter we sold our position in Inari Medical after a takeout offer by Stryker Corp. of USD 80 per share (Reuters, 07.01.2025).
