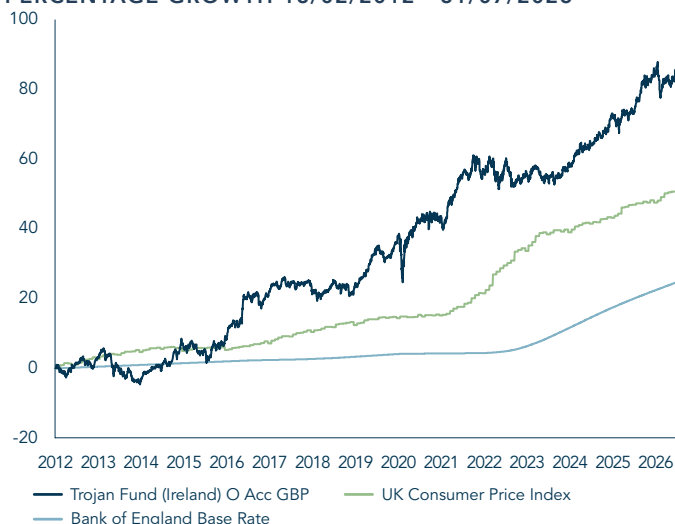

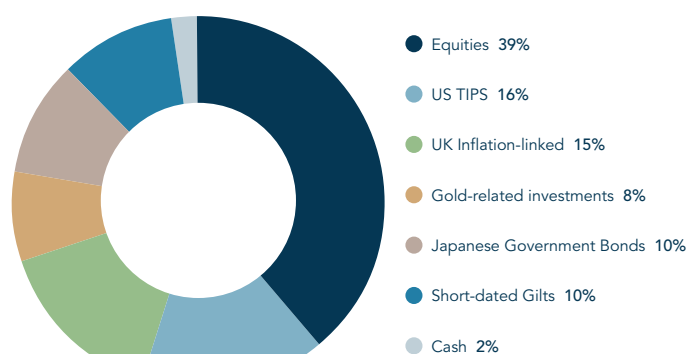

July Commentary

Your Fund (O Acc GBP) returned +1.4% during the month.

The World Cup seems a distant memory. The rowdy renditions of Hey Jude, along with the flags, can be put to rest for a few years. July also saw the half-time score for many of the Fund's holdings and, in some cases, the World Cup was indeed cited as a driver of some of the growth achieved in the first six months of 2026.

Visa, a major sponsor of the tournament, saw an acceleration of payment volumes. These were both cross-border payments into the US and growth in domestic transactions. Revenue, earnings and volumes all grew double digits. Visa had been seen as a potential 'AI loser' earlier in the year, but there is little evidence of this so far. On the contrary, the company's payment rails remain essential financial infrastructure. Visa has undergone a reorganisation where it is leveraging AI to help with faster product innovation whilst cutting 7% of the tech workforce. We expect many similar announcements as AI enables corporations to find new efficiencies and ways of structuring their businesses.

Unilever delivered their best quarterly volume performance since 2010 of +5.5%, we think partly assisted by the World Cup, which the company had especially targeted as a major promotional and 'brand activation' event. But there are also clear signs of better execution across the business. Encouragingly, 15 of their 30 'power brands' including Dove, Vaseline and Comfort grew double digits and gained market share.

Turning to the macro, government bond yields continue to rise, as investors anticipate growing inflationary pressures combined with deteriorating fiscal positions. The Japanese yen remains extremely cheap, and we were pleased to see coordinated intervention in the foreign exchange market by the US and Japan at the end of the month. These two issues of bond yields and currencies are not unrelated. The yen weakness is a global problem because Japan is selling US Treasuries to fund its currency support. Hedge funds remain very short of yen in a crowded trade¹. This could reverse painfully for those happy to pick up pennies in front of the steam roller.

¹ Crowded trade - A market position that is held by a large number of investors, increasing the risk of sharp price movements if many seek to exit simultaneously.

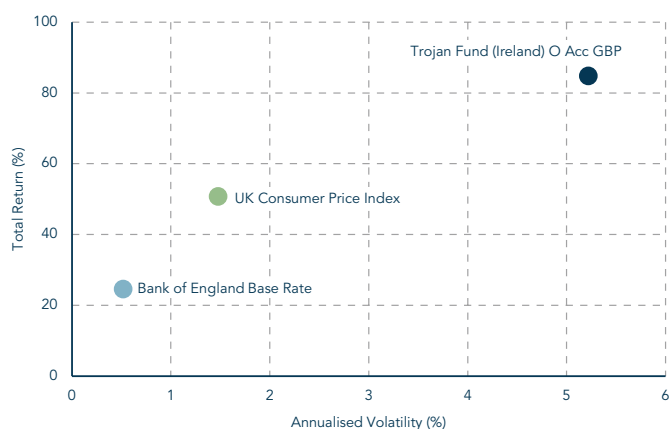
