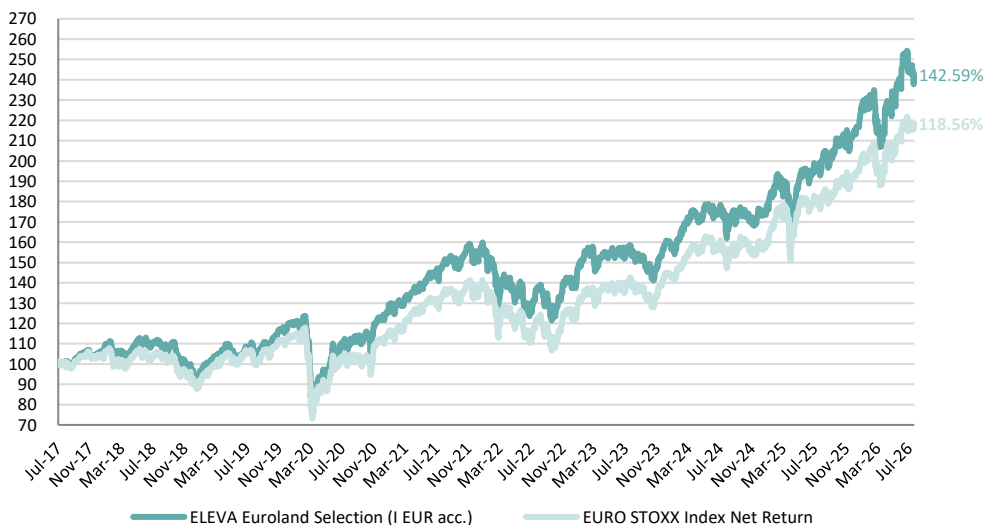

Monthly Comment

European markets posted a modest gain in July, in a month marked by renewed geopolitical tensions and violent factor rotations. The US-Iran conflict re-escalated sharply, with the Strait of Hormuz shutting again following fresh US airstrikes and the interim peace deal effectively suspended, keeping oil prices volatile. The AI/Momentum trade suffered a brutal unwind, fueled by concerns over excess computing capacity, leading to a steep fall in semiconductors and tech-related names, which was exacerbated by forced deleveraging of hedge funds and levered ETF exposure. Central banks added to the uncertainty: the Fed held rates steady but struck a less dovish tone than expected with three dissents, while the ECB kept the door open to a further hike after June's move. Long term interest rates moved up in the month. Economic and earnings news flow in Europe was otherwise supportive.
In this context, ELEVA Euroland Selection was down 3.51% vs an index down 0.23%, an underperformance of 328 bps.

Sector allocation had a slightly negative impact, affected by the underweight in energy and in consumer discretionary as well as the overweight in industrials, but somewhat compensated by the positive impact of the underweight in technology as well as the overweight in materials and consumer staples. Stock picking was negative, particularly in industrials, technology and financials.

ArcelorMittal performed well, surprised positively on European profitability and struck an upbeat tone on future earnings. Banks performed well, with positive comments on net interest and commission income combined with a good discipline on growth. **National Bank of Greece, UniCredit** and **Societe Generale** were the positive outliers. The rotation out of tech was one of the most brutal on record, and impacted **ASM International, ASML** and **STMicroelectronics**. Better than expected earnings and outlook for **ASMI** and **ASML** did not change the market sentiment. Industrials exposed to electrification were also hit severely. **Prysmian** and **Legrand** underperformed materially despite upgrading both their guidance for 2026. **UCB** was hit as their drug Bimzelx only met investors' expectations in H1 2026. Here again, the profitability guidance upgrade was not rewarded by investors. Regarding our proprietary macroeconomic indicators, the ELEVA Capital Index Europe (ECI) is still pointing upwards, as is the ECI China. The ECI is stabilizing at a high level. The impact of the Middle East conflict looks limited, growth expectations are likely to improve, and the inflation outlook is also likely to be more predictable. In this context, companies should have strong earnings growth. We note that corporates remain active in mergers and acquisitions and share buy backs.
Value and cyclicals were at 52.7% and 68.4% of the fund respectively, both down on the previous month.

Since inception, ELEVA Euroland Selection is up 142.59% vs an index up 118.56%, an outperformance of 2,403 bps.

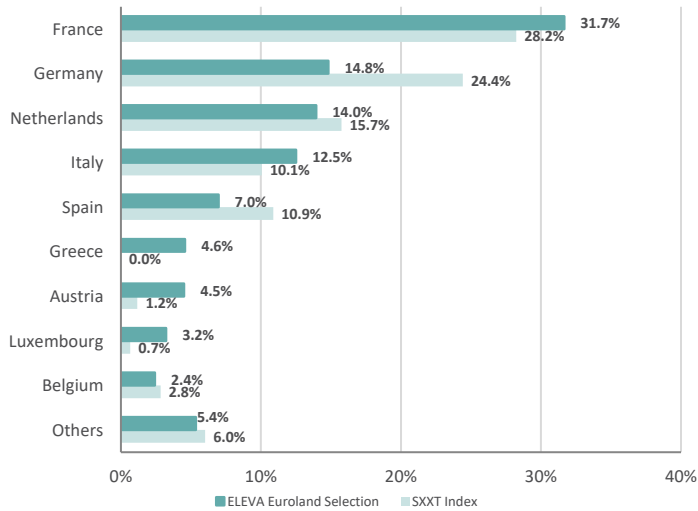

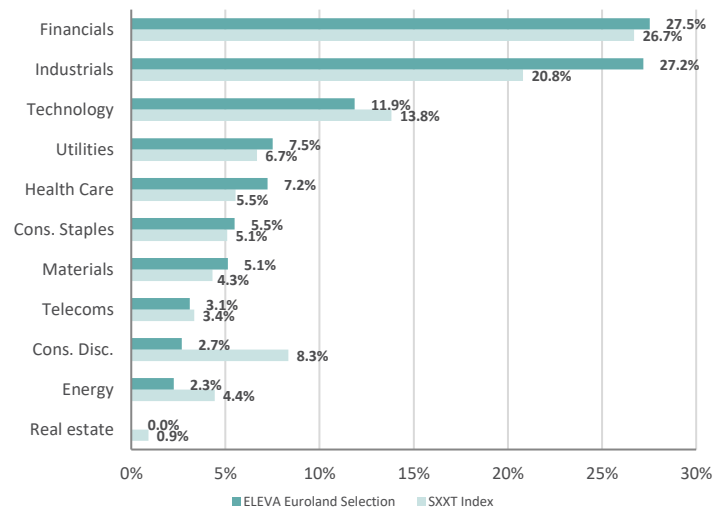
Geographic breakdown

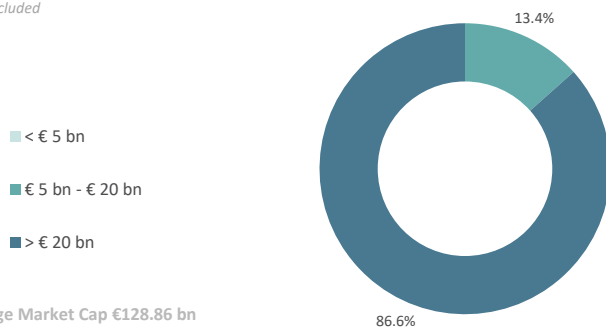
Sector breakdown

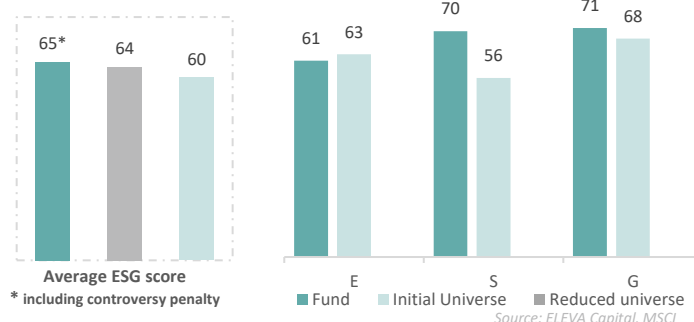

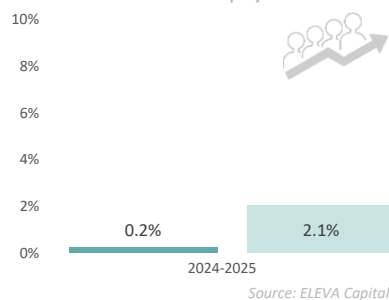

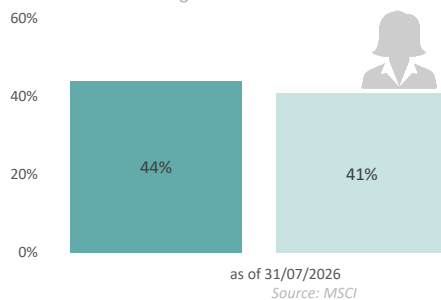

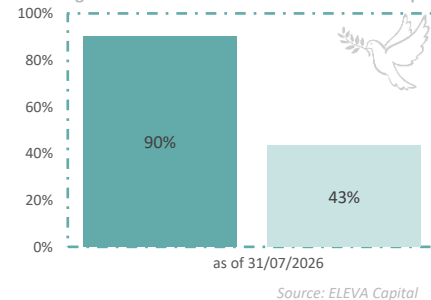
Growth in the number of employees



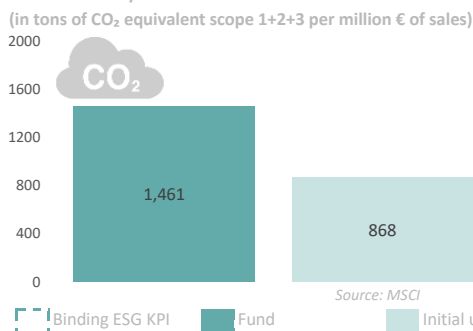
Percentage of women on the board



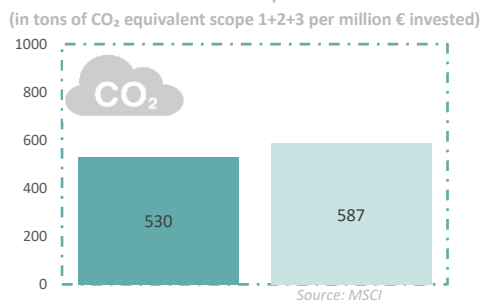
